the section entitled "Academic Program Changes:"

"In submitting a name change request that would result in titling an existing concentration in an accredited program as a degree, provide program enrollment, graduation, and alumni outcome data for the preceding three years, a copy of the accreditation review report received within the preceding three years, and the most recent accreditation status letter from an accrediting body that is a member of the Association of

Specialized and Professional Accreditors."

The Guidelines for public program approval contain a section that focuses on the process for academic program changes that concern certificates, concentrations, and program name changes. These changes are reviewed by Board staff and do not require action by the Board. Staff is recommending an additional category of academic program change.

In some cases, institutions may submit to change the name of an existing concentration, such that it will be a degree program. In the case of programs that are accredited without sanction by an Association of Specialized and Professional Accreditors (ASPA) accrediting body, BHE would not treat the request as a new program evaluation. Rather, the request to rename the concentration as a degree would require approval by the Vice Chancellor, as the Chancellor's designee, upon limited staff review.

Institutions that achieve and maintain professional accreditation for their programs are required to demonstrate that these programs meet similar criteria to that in the guidelines. Accreditation processes of ASPA members, in particular, require completion of rigorous quality reviews that examine all aspects of programs and the resources devoted to them, including faculty, curriculum, facilities, and institutional support. Such accreditation is required of programs whose graduates require licensure in their respective field. In most cases, evaluators who conduct BHE program reviews also have accreditation review experience.

Specialized and professional accrediting bodies in the United States operate to ensure that students in educational programs receive an education consistent with standards for entry into practice or advanced practice in each of their respective fields or disciplines.

In recognition of the significant resources input by campuses into programs that earn and maintain this type of accreditation and in view of the requirement that these programs meet criteria similar to those required by the Board for degrees, staff recommends that requests that would result in renaming an existing concentration in an ASPA member-accredited program to a degree, be accompanied by submission of information regarding enrollment trends, graduates and accreditation. The requested change to rename the concentration as a degree would require approval by the Vice Chancellor, as the Chancellor's designee, upon limited staff review.

Specifically, staff recommends that the Board amend the *Procedures For New Academic Program Proposals And Program Changes Public Institutions of Higher Education* by adding the following language to the section entitled "Academic Program Changes:"

"In submitting a name change request that would result in titling an existing concentration in an accredited program as a degree, provide program enrollment, graduation, and alumni outcome data for the preceding three years, a copy of the accreditation review report received within the preceding three years, and the most recent accreditation status letter from an accrediting body that is a member of the Association of Specialized and Professional Accreditors."

In its entirety, the amended section would read as follows:

ACADEMIC PROGRAM CHANGES

A public college or university expecting to offer (a) new certificate programs under 30 credits, or (b) new minors, concentrations, tracks, or options within existing programs is to notify the Chancellor of Higher Education in writing at least 60 days prior to announcing such program changes. These changes do not require action by BHE.

Changes in the name of an existing program require approval by the Vice Chancellor, as the Chancellor's designee, upon limited staff review. In submitting a name change request, the institution should include curriculum information and reason for the request.

In submitting a name change request that would result in titling an existing concentration in an accredited program as a degree, provide program enrollment, graduation, and alumni outcome data for the preceding three years, a copy of the accreditation review report received within the preceding three years, and the most recent accreditation status letter from an accrediting body that is a member of the Association of Specialized and Professional Accreditors.

An institution is to notify the Chancellor of Higher Education in writing if it suspends or discontinues an academic program. When a program is suspended or discontinued, it will be removed from BHE's inventory of active, authorized programs. A program suspended or discontinued may be reactivated only with the approval of BHE.

An institution is to notify the Chancellor of Higher Education in writing if it suspends or discontinues, or reactivates a suspended or discontinued, minor, concentration, track, or option within an existing program.
