APPROVAL OF NEW PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT METRICS

MOVED: The Massachusetts Board of Higher Education (BHE) hereby approves the ***New and Enhanced Performance Measurement System***, which replaces the previous system authorized under AAC 04-01. This includes a revised list of performance measurement metrics with enhanced measures and analytic detail. The Commissioner is instructed to initiate the immediate implementation of this system consistent with the BHE's statutory responsibility to demonstrate our accountability to the public and provide a resource for institutional self-assessment.

Authority: Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 15A, Section 7A

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Background

In the General Appropriations Act of 1997, the Board of Higher Education was mandated to develop, in collaboration with the institutions, a performance accountability system for state and community colleges “in order to promote accountability for effective management and stewardship of public funds and to achieve and demonstrate measurable educational outcomes.”

In June 2003 this performance measurement language was strengthened and expanded in the Board of Higher Education’s statute (Chapter 15A). In the General Laws of Massachusetts, Chapter 15a, Section 7a, it states that, “in order to promote accountability for effective management and stewardship of public funds and to achieve and demonstrate measurable educational outcomes, the institutions shall certify achievement of public higher education accountability objectives through a performance measurement system.”

Chapter 15a, Section 7a, goes on to establish requirements for the development the Public Higher Education Performance Measurement System in Massachusetts including:

- formation of a Performance Measurement Taskforce,
 - inclusion of specific institutional outcome metrics,
 - use of institution-specific peers for benchmarking, and
- public access to institution-level accountability reporting.

The need for a strong accountability system became a major discussion item during the 2003 Legislative session. The Chancellor and the Chairman of the Board of Higher Education made a commitment to Legislative leadership that the implementation of a strong accountability system would be a Board priority in the coming year and that a Condition of Higher Education report would be presented to the Governor and Legislature.

Beginning in 2004, the Board of Higher Education began to evaluate campus performance and produce an annual report of findings in compliance with Chapter 15a, Section 7a. These reports were developed in collaboration with campus representatives and outside experts and included a broad range of metrics, institution-level data, institution-level benchmarks/peer comparisons and descriptions of best practices. These reports continued through 2010, after which they were put on hold for the development of an alternative system-level accountability project known as the Vision Project.

The Vision Project was authorized under a different section of Chapter 15a (Section 9). Requirements within this section include the requirement of routine data submissions and analyses, but do not have the specific accountability language found in section 7a. The first Vision Project report was produced in 2012. The focus of this report was to assess the performance of our public higher education segments in comparison with estimations of state-level “best in nation” performance. They also included commentary and descriptions of “best practices.” These reports continued until 2016, when the Board moved to initiate an overarching review of our performance measurement system.

The 2016 Board motion states: "For the reasons set forth in the background document, the Board of Higher Education (BHE) hereby charges the Department of Higher Education to initiate a System-Wide Performance Measurement Taskforce and to work closely with the campuses to examine the relevance and accuracy of our Performance Measurement System. Included in the review will be the relevant legislation as well as performance metrics, benchmarks, institutional and segmental goals, peer comparisons, and options for reporting and sharing analyses."

The rationale for this review was stated as follows: "In order to achieve the highest possible levels of self-assessment and continuous improvement, our system for measuring institutional performance must undergo a dynamic and iterative process of review. By engaging in such a process, we can ensure that our strategic goals are clearly defined and remain relevant to current public higher education missions and objectives. It also gives us the opportunity to reassess the quality of our existing data and analyses and to examine the possible introduction of newly developed metrics that may provide greater accuracy."

The DHE initiated the System-Wide Performance Measurement Taskforce required by the Board's motion. The Taskforce was composed of a Steering Committee and four Working Groups that addressed specific areas of institutional performance. The DHE convened 14 total meetings which included more than 70 campus representatives. Three Board members served on the Taskforce as well. National experts were also included in these meetings to provide valuable insights and advice regarding effective performance measurement. The result of these meetings is a recommendation of an initial set of metrics in each key performance area and a recommendation to establish Tableau as the environment for delivering Performance Measurement Dashboards to internal and external audiences.

Proposed Performance Indicators

The attached document provides a summary of the key performance indicators developed by Board staff in consultation with representatives from all segments of public higher education in Massachusetts. Detailed information on benchmarks and targets is provided as well as timelines for completion.
