Background

The Cash Grant Program is designed to assist students with financial need in meeting mandatory fees and non-state-supported tuition. It is a complementary program to the Need-Based Tuition Waiver Program.

Funding for the Cash Grant Program, currently \$26,391,254, is based on the annual appropriation for state financial aid. Each year, the Board of Higher Education votes on how these funds will be distributed among the campuses.

As with the Need-Based Tuition Waiver program, beginning in Fiscal Year 2012, a new formula model will be used to determine Cash Grant allocations. The formula utilizes three-year average data and a two-year phase-in approach. The revised formula is reflective of the financial need of enrolled students, as it considers those eligible for the Federal Pell Grant, as well as those that mirror median income families within the Commonwealth. This new formula model follows recommendations from the Task Force on Student Financial Aid report, as accepted by the Board of Higher Education in 2006. These recommendations encouraged the allocation of need-based state financial aid to institutions whose students demonstrate the greatest financial need.

The Department of Higher Education held several meetings to discuss the implementation of a formula model with college and university presidents, members of the public college financial aid community and various campus representatives, over the past twenty-four months. Overall, institutions have responded positively regarding the fairness of the proposed formula and its impact on annual allocations.

The attached allocations assume level funding of the Cash Grant Program in FY2012. The Board of Higher Education, however, may revise the allocations on the basis of the most current annual enrollment and financial aid data, and if future state appropriations for financial aid were to differ, requiring an adjustment in the proposed allocations.
