What is PIF?

The Performance Incentive Fund (PIF) advances academic excellence and increases opportunity for all students by supporting innovative programs focused on the **DHE's "Big Three" Objectives:**

1. Making College More Accessible & Affordable
2. Closing Gaps in Student Opportunity & Achievement
3. Improving College Completion Rates

How is PIF improving college outcomes?

In FY18, PIF provided \$1.2 million in funding for systemwide innovation projects including the creation of **MassTransfer A2B (Associate to Bachelor's) Pathways** in an ever-growing number of disciplines. The Commonwealth's high-quality, cost-effective transfer options help students avoid excess debt. PIF also funded over \$1.2 million in competitive grants for campus pilot programs, including:

■ Open Educational Resources (OER)

FY18 Grants: **Bristol, Greenfield, Massasoit and Mt. Wachusett Community Colleges**

Development and adoption of free, public-domain teaching, learning, and research materials, saving students hundreds of dollars on textbooks per participating course.

With students struggling to cover the costs of tuition and fees alone, OER expansion is an opportunity to help with the hardships students face in paying for college."

■ Co-Requisite Remediation

FY18 Grants: **Fitchburg State University and Quinsigamond Community College**

Course redesign to allow students to take developmental and credit-bearing courses simultaneously. Students progress more quickly through degree requirements, reducing costs, improving retention & completion rates.



■ 100 Males to College

FY18 Grants: New pilot in **Salem** and continuing pilots in **Springfield, Framingham, Brockton and Worcester**

Creating community + K-12 + campus partnerships to provide targeted supports for small cohorts of low-income males and males of color, with the goal of substantially increasing the percentage who graduate high school, apply to college, are accepted, matriculate, are retained, and graduate with a bachelor's degree within five years. The first cohort of students in Springfield had a 95% college-going rate.
