Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Background & Overview

- Teachers can change the lives of students and families, making teaching one of the most important, yet challenging careers
- Qualified teachers are in demand across the country and in Massachusetts, with many communities experiencing teacher shortages
- Unfortunately, the rising cost of college tuition can pose challenges for those wishing to become educators
 - On average, tuition and fees alone can cost \$15,755 for a full-time student at UMASS and roughly \$11,300 at state universities
 - That cost is significantly higher at independent colleges, ranging from a low of \$40,912 to as much as \$65,222

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Background & Overview


- Financial support can often mean the difference in a student's ability to become a teacher
- Massachusetts offers several funding options for future teachers, that include scholarships, grants, forgivable loans, and tuition waivers
 - Programs are purposed to meet workforce demands
 - Focus is on diversification of the teaching profession
 - Programs constructed with stakeholder (EEC, DESE, MTA) input and collaboration
- Challenge is to promote teaching as a viable profession, as some may view teaching as less attractive for a variety of reasons

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Goal is to increase pool of eligible teachers from all populations, with a focus on underrepresented students

2019-2020 MA Students-Teachers Diversity Gaps



Resources for Teacher Education Program Students MassTeach

- Selection Process: Application and Interview
- Scholar Benefits
 - Advising
 - Relationships and high-touch supports (faculty, staff, and peers)
 - \$20,000-\$30,000 Scholarship while at university
- Service Obligation: 2 years of service for 1 year of scholarship (4 years total) in a high need school district
- Outcomes
 - First 3 scholars are currently teaching
 - 4 cohorts of 16 Scholars
 - Goal is 41 Scholars



Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Early Childhood Educators Scholarship

- Funded as a pilot initiative in FY2005 by the Legislature
 - Purpose: Increase the quality and availability of teachers and care providers to work with young children and youth in inclusive settings including infant/toddler, preschool and school age programs.
 - Initial appropriation: \$1 million
 - Current appropriation: \$5 million
- Student Eligibility
 - Employed for at <u>least six months & 20 hours per week</u>, as an educator or provider in an early education and care program or out of school time program
 - Enroll in a certificate, associate, bachelor's, master's degree program in an eligible childhood education




Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Early Childhood Educators Scholarship

- Scholarship is based on a per credit rate, depending on the type of institution (2-year or 4-year)
 - Range of \$250 to \$500 per credit
 - Semester award range from \$2,250 to \$4,500
- Applicants may receive scholarships to assist with the cost of no more than three courses/11 credits per semester
- Service Obligation
 - Continue employment as an early childhood educator or provider in Massachusetts
 - Service ranges from 6 months to 2 years dependent on amount of funding received

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Paraprofessional Teacher Preparation Grant


- Provides financial assistance to Massachusetts residents who are currently employed as paraprofessionals in Massachusetts public schools and wish to become certified as full-time teachers.
- Student Eligibility:
 - Employed as a paraprofessional for at least two-years in a Massachusetts <u>public K-12</u> school
 - Work at least 20 hours per week
 - Grants may be awarded to paraprofessionals with less than two years of employment if enrolled in a high-need discipline (Mathematics, Science, Foreign Languages, Bilingual Education)

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Paraprofessional Teacher Preparation Grant

- Enroll in an undergraduate degree program (full-time or part-time) that offers a DESE approved teacher preparation program leading to licensure
- Scholarships are based on a per credit rate, depending on the type of institution (2-year or 4-year):
 - \$250 to \$625 per credit
 - \$4,000 to \$7,500 per academic year
- Service Obligation
 - Secure employment as a full-time teacher in a Massachusetts public school (K- 12)
 - Ranges from a minimum of two and a maximum of four years, depending on the number of semesters of grant assistance received



Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Tomorrow's Teacher Scholarship

 Purposed to help diversify the teaching profession by attracting and encouraging underrepresented students (high school and college) to become licensed to teach in the Massachusetts k-12 public school system


• Guidelines on tap to be presented to the BHE for approval

- Outlines recipient eligibility criteria
- Provide guidance for institutions in administering the program and related support services to students
- First scholarships awarded for the 2023-24 academic year
- Service-obligated Scholarship
 - Recipient agrees to teach as a condition of receiving scholarship

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Tomorrow's Teacher Scholarship

Student Eligibility Options

- Enroll fulltime in an undergraduate degree program or post baccalaureate course of study that meets the certification requirements for licensure/employment at a Massachusetts public elementary or secondary school
- DESE Issued Licenses and Racial Diversity 2020-2022



* No Emergency licenses were issued prior to the 2020 school year.

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Tomorrow's Teacher Scholarship

- Scholarship Conditions and Recipient Responsibilities
 - Repay through service schedule (i.e., one year of teaching per year of scholarship assistance)
 - Become employed as a teacher of record, within 12 months of degree completion or the completion of post-baccalaureate coursework
- Award Value
 - Scholarship assistance determined annually, up to \$25,000 per year
 - Based on Cost of Attendance for tuition, fees and related educational expenses
 - Undergraduates can receive scholarship for a maximum of 4 years
 - Students pursuing post-baccalaureate coursework may be assisted for maximum of three (3) semesters

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Teacher Loan Forgiveness

- The Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program is purposed to assist a diverse population of qualified Massachusetts K-12 public school teachers with loan repayment
- Teacher Eligibility
 - Have completed a bachelor's degree program at a Massachusetts public institution of higher education after January 1, 2020
 - Have outstanding educational debt that was incurred to pay tuition, fees or additional costs of attendance

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Teacher Loan Forgiveness

Student Eligibility

- Commit to and work for 4 years in a school district as a teacher, instructional or program paraprofessional, or in any other position that requires a license or other form of certification issued by the department of elementary and secondary education
- Priority shall be given to educators working in school districts with higher shares of students who are designated as low income, as defined in said section 2 of said chapter 70

Award Amount

• Teachers will receive up to \$7,500 each year they fulfill their obligation

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students Communications/Outreach Strategy

- Line Item: Permits the use of funds to support public awareness campaign
- Objective: Publicize Tomorrow's Teachers Scholarship and Loan Forgiveness programs to maximize reach
- Value: Change perception of teaching as a career
 - Highlight connections to Equity Agenda values
- Process
 - Competitive RFP via COMMBUYS
 - 4 proposals received
 - Selected C+C

Resources for Teacher Education Program Students C+C

- Phase 1 (January 30-June 30)
 - Tying work to Strategic Plan for Racial Equity
 - Focusing on designing collateral and implementation
 - Differentiating this program from others
 - Simple messaging
 - Leveraging key calendar dates (Black History Month, Pi Day)
 - Landing page, key audience engagement, real stories
 - Paid and earned media
 - Using KPIs to measure success
- Phase 2 (potential to extend contract)
 - Engaging community-based organizations
