


What is Generative Al?


How does it work?

AI Models are trained on vasts amount of information



How does it work?

All this data allows the model to make connections




How does it work?

This model is used to make output predictions based on the input we ask it.



We can think of our input, or our 'prompt', as a way of activating knowledge in the AI model



The important thing about prompting is giving the AI as much context as possible - even if it is messy!

- -begin with an anecdote related to pets
- -be lighthearted but still kind of formal

• Set the mood or attitude of the prompt, such as professional, friendly, or authoritative, to match the audience's expectations.

Topic: What It's About

 Specify the subject matter or content area that the prompt should address to maintain relevance and focus.

 - This prompt is designed for the university's assessment team, aiming to analyze program reviews effectively and efficiently.
- [Task]: Analyze Program Review Data

- [Tone]: Professional and Analytical
 - The response should be formal and data-driven, providing clear, objective insights suitable for academic and administrative review.
- [Topic]: Program Review for Academic Assessment
 - Focus on specific aspects of academic programs such as learning outcomes, student satisfaction, and faculty engagement within the context of institutional assessment goals.




