



CUNY ASAP ORIGIN AND SCALING STORY



– **CITY OF NEW YORK INVESTS \$19.5 MILLION IN CUNY ASAP PILOT** 2006

Mayor Bloomberg launches a new division of his office, the Center for Economic Opportunity (now NYC Opportunity), to fund promising programs addressing economic mobility. Then-CUNY Chancellor Matthew Goldstein pitches a comprehensive synthesis of evidence-based best practices to address stubbornly low CUNY community college graduation rates. Mayor Bloomberg regularly cites ASAP as an important component of his economic development agenda.

CUNY ASAP | ACE EVIDENCE BASE SNAPSHOT

ASAP has an **average three-year graduation rate of 53.4%** vs. 24.6% for the historical matched comparison group.

ASAP **narrows equity gaps for Black and Hispanic males** and has demonstrated that all subgroups benefit from the program.

A rigorous RCT study of John Jay ACE demonstrated significant impact on five-year graduation rates: **68.8%** (vs. 57.1% for the control group).

John Jay and Lehman ACE F19-F21 transfer cohorts demonstrated a **68.4% two-year grad rate** (vs. 39% for comparable advanced standing transfer students).

▪ OHIO Replication Demonstration (2014-2018)

CUNY ASAP|ACE partnered with three OH community colleges to replicate the model. An RCT conducted by MDRC showed that the replications nearly doubled three-year graduation rates and has demonstrated long term positive gains on employment and earnings.

▪ EARLY EVIDENCE emerging for Westchester County Community Colleges' Viking ROADS (2022)

In F22, MDRC's RCT of VR demonstrated positive findings on full time enrollment and credit accumulation. The final report will be released in late 2024.

Transformation Fund Overview

\$60 MILLION CAMPUS TRANSFORMATION INITIATIVES FUND

Each SUNY campus will receive a set allocation that must be used to adopt **evidence-based transformational interventions focused on improving the student experience and outcomes and ensuring greater operational efficiency**. The following slide describes uses of this Fund, and each campus plan must be approved in order to move forward. Funding will be contingent on the achievement of interim measures of progress.



Investing in Evidence-Based Transformation

AT LEAST 50% OF THE ALLOCATION MUST BE USED FOR ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

- 1 Enhancing economic mobility through **preparation for employment in high-demand fields**
- 2 Increasing **retention and completion** of degree-seeking students through replication of the ASAP and ACE evidence-based strategies

UP TO 50% OF THE ALLOCATION MAY BE USED WITHIN ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

- 3 Expanding or launching **truly seamless transfer pathways including joint/dual admissions** between associate/bachelor's degree programs
- 4 Increasing **operational efficiency** and elimination of redundancy
- 5 Delivering **essential student supports** for targeted under-served populations



SUNY ASAP|ACE Timeline and Key Milestones

June 2023: Campuses learn about ASAP as part of the roll out of the Transformation Fund planning process (including CUNY ASAP|ACE Webinar)

July 2023: Individual office hours with campuses who expressed interest to determine campuses for ASAP|ACE replication success

August 2023:

- 25 campuses submit plan to replicate ASAP|ACE with Transformation Funds - review and finalization
- SUNY OSS raises additional funds to build program capacity (\$4.8M to date)

September 2023: SUNY ASAP|ACE Campus Partners (13 Community Colleges and 12 Baccalaureate granting campuses) announced with target of 3,750 students

September 2023 – May 2024: Implementation planning and technical assistance for campuses from SUNY OSS and CUNY ASAP|ACE

February 2024: Pilot programs launched at all campuses in Spring 2024

Fall 2024: Reached total enrollment of 4,270 students



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Overview of SUNY ASAP|ACE

- **Financial Resources to Remove Barriers to FT Attendance**
 - Cost of Attendance Award (\$400 for ASAP / \$550 for ACE)
 - Transportation/Monthly Stipend (\$50/month)
 - Textbook/Materials (\$150 per semester)
- **Wraparound Supports to Enhance Integration and Belonging**
 - High-Touch Advisement (one dedicated Advisor)
 - Career Development and Academic Support Activities
 - Pre-semester Orientations
- **Structured Pathways to Build Academic Momentum**
 - Consolidated Course Schedules
 - Blocked Courses for First-Year Students
 - Winter and Summer Course Taking

Early Impact: SUNY Student Success

+20% higher **credit completion** rate for **ASAP** students in Spring 2024 compared to similar non-ASAP students

+9% higher **credit completion** rate for **ACE** students in Spring 2024 compared to similar non-ACE students

80% Spring-to-Fall **persistence** rate for **ASAP** students (vs. 72% for similar non-ASAP students)

88% Spring-to-Fall **persistence** rate for **ACE** students (vs. 85% for similar non-ACE students)
