John Saltmarsh is the director of NERCHE and a faculty member at the University of Massachusetts Boston. He is the author, most recently, of two co-edited volumes, *Publicly Engaged Scholars: Next-Generation Engagement* and the

Future of Higher Education (2016) and *To Serve a Larger Purpose: Engagement for Democracy and the Transformation of Higher Education* (2011). He is also the author of numerous articles on civic engagement, service-learning, and experiential education. He is an associate editor for the *Michigan Journal of Community Service-Learning*, and serves on the National Advisory Board of *Imagining America*, a member of the board of the International Association for Research on Service Learning and Community Engagement (IARSLCE), a member of the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AACU). He holds a PhD in American History from Boston University.
